

In the name of god. amen. I Henry Guterman of Bullitt County and State of Kentucky being in full and sound mind and perfect memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in the form following that is to say: I give my so called in the hands of Almighty God that I have and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried. I intend by the directions of my Executors and as touching my several Estates which it hath pleased god to bless me with. I give and bequeath in the manner and form following that is to say first of all my lawful debts to be paid I desire and will that that my Plantations that I have as is to be given to my Daughter Elizabeth her life time and then to be sold and Equally divided amongst my four Daughters that is to say: Mary & Sarah and my daughter. I also will that my Daughter Elizabeth shall be paid my possessions of all my other personal household furniture &c. I give and bequeath to my true friend one hundred acres of Land adjoining to my Plantations to him and his heirs. I desire my true friend John Thomas and one George George Guterman to be Executors to my Estate to be signed & delivered in presence of us this 25th day of November 1813
