I, Hugh Berkley of Bullitt County, and Commonwealth of Kentucky, publicly in my health and senses, do make, and ordain this my last will and testament. Now. After all my just debts are paid, I make Catharine Berkley my sister, heir to my estate during her natural life, with a few exceptions. Hannahauko Berkley, I leave one negro boy named Sam. Melinaa Berkley, I leave one negro boy named Sam. Septimus Berkley I leave one negro boy named Tom. Jonathan Berkley, I leave one negro boy named Martin. Nancy Duncan who was Nancy Berkley before married, I leave one negro boy named Ben. Elizabeth May who was Elizabeth Berkley, before married, I leave the youngest child of Ursilla, not yet named Winifred whom I set my hand and seal this day and year above written.
