In the name of God Amen I Zealy Williams Senior of Bullitt county and State of Kentucky being aged and infirm in body but thanks to God of sound mind and memory and knowing the uncertainty of life do think fit so to dispose of the property which God in his providence has given me in such a manner as shall be satisfactory to myself and which I do in the following manner. First (G^d commending my soul to God who gave it and my body buried in such manner as my friends may direct. It is my will and desire that all my just debts shall be paid. I give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Williams all my estate both personal real and mixed during her natural life and after her death to be divided in the following manner. I give unto my son Zealy Williams fifty cents I give unto my son Isaac Williams fifty cents I give unto my son Henry Williams fifty cents I give unto my daughter Mary Ann Williams formerly Williams fifty cents I give unto my daughter Peggy Eckart formerly Williams fifty cents I give unto my daughter Agnes Ann formerly Williams fifty cents I give unto my daughter Susan Gordon formerly Williams fifty cents to be paid them by my executor out of my estate or full of these legacies of my estate the balance of my estate personal real and mixed after paying my just debts and the above mentioned legacies I give to my sons James Williams George Williams and my daughter Minerva Williams and Seytha Williams to be equally divided between them I do hereby constitute and appoint my Executor to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former

Lucy Williams Sr again produced in open court the paper as the will of Zealy Williams Sr deceased and asked the court to reconsider the former order made this day on the subject of said will. And thereupon the court took up the motion and Eliza Collings a witness was sworn in court who made that the paper now in court was made by said Williams Sr his last will and testament and subscribed by said Williams as such and himself and others as witnesses and that said paper contained the whole will of said decedent except the names of said decedent and witnesses Isaac Collings and Archibald Collings were sworn as witnesses in court and sworn that they believed said paper was the true last will and testament of decedent except the names aforesaid. All these witnesses swore that the testator was in his proper senses when said paper was executed and that he decedent was capable of executing such a paper whereupon said court received said will as fully proved as above and ordered that the same be recorded as the last will and testament of decedent Zealy Williams Sr which said will is truly entered of record as aforesaid.
