 and his heirs forever - also I give and bequeath to my daughter Arab
 Sumner, the remainder of land not killed that I thought of Mr. Richard
 Smith, joining Marie Ant. thence thence, with above, early, Susan & the
 former, to him and to hold to him and his heirs forever - also I give and
 bequeath to my daughter Susan Sumner 1/2 negroes, Charles, Mark, all my
 Charlotte & the former, to him and to hold to him and his heirs forever.
