After my Just debts and legacies hereafter mentioned are paid - I then It is further my Will & desire to give and bequeath to my grand sons and daughters, and and Daughters of Mary Spencer, heirs of said Mary Spencer as follows. - I then to Thomas Spencer, John Spencer, Isaac Spencer, James Spencer, John Spencer, Mary Spencer - Thompson Spencer, Elizabeth Spencer, & Lucy Spencer, one hundred dollars to be equally divided between them as they shall arrive to lawfull age. Further I constitute and appoint my two friends Rodolphus Ouby and Charles Seaver my sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament discharging and revoking all other Wills heretofore by me made in testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal in the year of our late one thousand eight hundred and eleven and on the thirty first day of May of the same year
