I also give Lydia to my wife Eliza both and her other increase during her natural life and also all and every part my estate to during her natural life and at her death the property to be equally divided between all of my children. and also at my son Thomas death the negro boy shall return to my son James T. Thummond. I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this second day of March Eighteen hundred and twenty four.

negroes that is to say Elizabeth, Miriam, Louisa, Caroline
and Harrison during her natural life provided she remain
a widow. Otherwise any half or an equal division. the
other half I give and bequeath to Benjamin Brashear
and all if he should be the longest liver. I give and
bequeath to Rebecca Brashear, Miriam, Caroline and
Harrison and their increase after the death of my Brother
Benjamin if he should be the longest liver, if said Rebecca
Brashear, Miriam should die before the inheritance or
possessed the aforesaid negroes to bequeath to her I give and
bequeath to ~~my~~ ^{my} Ocho Brashear. I further give and
bequeath to said Ocho Brashear the rest that is to say Elizabeth
Miriam, Louisa and their increase after the death of my
beloved wife; and brother Benjamin. I further give and
bequeath my beloved wife the residue (that is to say) the balance
of the sales of my land and stock &c after paying my just
debts. I appoint my beloved wife Executor and brother
Benjamin Brashear Executor of this my last will and
testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the 11 day of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand
Eight hundred and twenty four
