 We have also proceeded in obedience to your order to
 allot unto the said James halfpant his dower of the slaves
 of which the said above halfpant died seized and
 and possessed of, and have allotted unto James half-
 pant one negro woman named Pat, and one girl
 named Rachel, which we estimate to be worth
 four hundred and fifty eight dollars, thirty three
 cents, which in our opinion falls short living and
 dollars & half seven cents of being one third of the
 value of all the slaves that the said deceased
 died seized and possessed of, the said James halfpant
 to have and to hold the aforesaid land and slaves as
 his dower according to law.

We have omitted formal distribution of the land and
 slaves between the several legates on the ground that
 there are several of them infants and that there has
 been no guardians appointed for them, and those legates
 that are of age being present committed to make
 the division until proper arrangements can be made
 given from under our hands this 10th day of January
 1826.
