First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Martha Chappell all of my estate real and personal for her own use and benefit without interruption during her life time a widow. And then at her death a marriage I desire that all my estate real and personal may be sold and the proceeds thereof to be divided equally among my children and also my grand daughter Catherine Linsford with them. In Wasp house I bequeath, set my hands and affixed my seal this twentieth day of September One thousand Eight hundred and thirty four. Signed and sealed in the presence of us.
