 of September 1824. Examined, approved of and
 ordered to be entered of record: whereupon the same
 is truly recorded in my Office

In the name of God. I now to it remembered
 that I Harsham Brashear of Bullitt County State of
 Kentucky being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind
 and memory blessed be almighty God for the same do
 make and publish this my last will and testament in
 manner and form following that is to say first I give and
 bequeath to my beloved wife Cordelia Brashear all the
 negroes that is to say Elizabeth, Harian, Louisa, Caroline
 and Harrison during her natural life provided she remain
 a widow otherwise only half or an equal division. the
 other half I give and bequeath to Benjamin Brashear
 and all if he should be the longest liver. I give and
 bequeath to Rebecca Brashear, Minnie Caroline and
 Harrison and their increase after the death of my first son
 Benjamin if he should be the longest liver of said Rebecca
 Brashear Minnie should die before she inherit or
 possess the aforesaid negroes bequeathed to her I give and
 bequeath to said Rebecca Brashear I further give and
 bequeath to said Rebecca Brashear the rest that is to say Elizabeth
 Harian, Louisa and their increase after the death of my
 beloved wife; and brother Benjamin I further give and
 bequeath my beloved wife the residue (that is to say) the balance
 of the sales of my land and stock &c after paying my just
 debts. I appoint my beloved wife executrix and brother
 Benjamin Brashear co-executor of this my last will and
 testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 the 11 day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand
 eight hundred and twenty four
 signed published and sealed by the above
 named Harsham Brashear to his last
 will and testament in the presence of us
 who at his request and in his presence
 have hereunto subscribed our names as
 witnesses to the same June 19. 1824.
