Davison from the State of Kentucky now in the Mississippi Territory and the County Adams being in perfect mind and memory thanking the Good of my existence for the same and recommending my soul to God who gave it do make this my last will and Testament viz I give and bequeath unto Basil Crow that plantation which lies adjoining the place a near the place he now lives on in the State of Kentucky for his trouble in settling and adjusting my affairs in that State as agent for me I further desire him to pay the debts and adjust whatever amount or debts shall or may come against my Estate and to be my sole Executor and should it not be sufficient to satisfy him to be paid out of the Estate I desire my negroes in Kentucky to be divided equally between Benjamin Satchin my half brother and his father which is not my father my said brother is to carry the negroes to his father and to have the first choice of them I desire my work tools to be equally divided between Benjamin Satchin and William C. Smith as witness my hand and seal this 6th day of August 1801

yard and garden I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife
two cows and two calves two horses plow and gear all my house
hold and kitchen furniture - I give and bequeath to my beloved
Sister Barbara one half of my stock of Hogs, be there moved
up it is further my desire that all the residue of my stock of
Cattle shall be sold to pay my last debts also the part I owned
a wagon between myself and sister Barbara to be also appraised
above it is further my will and desire that my negro man Arthur
named here shall be hired by my executor hereafter named for a
length of time that is untill he shall pay by his hire all my last
debts together with the sale of the property above mentioned to be
sold and at the expiration of such time when the hire of him
said Arthur shall discharge the said debts then and in that case
immediately be free and at full liberty from me my heirs execs
or administrators or any other persons or persons further I constitute
and appoint my friend Austin Grable Sole Executor of this my last
will and testament disannulling and revoking all other wills
heretofore by me made In testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed
my hand and seal the fourteenth day of July in the year of
Lord one thousand eight hundred and fourteen 1814
