State of Massachusetts being of sound mind and disposing do make &
declare this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking all former
wills & testaments by me heretofore made. I have, I will & devise
after my death that I be decently buried by Christian burial to
be paid out of my personal property. 2.^d I will and bequeath to my
beloved wife Nathaniel Jones all my estate both real & personal
I mean my personal property and the land whereon I now live: and
after my death the same with all the advantages and increases of
said property both real and personal is to belong to Henry Jones, of whom
I am called Henry Jones and he is the son of my said wife Nathaniel
Jones and to him & his heirs and assigns. And whereas I have not
a debt for the land but have paid for the same with the assistance of
said Henry I hereby will & devise that the said Henry (as for and having
the said paid land (137 acres more or less) more or less in his own name: and having
with all the property which he has pleased him to help me with: I have set my hand
and seal this 11.th day of January 1749. John + Jones (Seal)

This last will & Testament of John Jones Quaker was this day presented in open Court and proved by the Oathes of Nathaniel P. Saunders and John Raymond, two of the subscribing Witnesses to the same, as the law requires, and was added to the minute of records, which is done.

In the Name of God, Amen, I, Mary I. Hart do make this my last Will and Testament, being weak in body, but sound in mind & memory, Knowing that it is appointed once for all to die, do make this my last Will, that is to say, Item first, first, I give my soul to Almighty God, committing my body to the Earth, from whence it came, to be buried after a decent Christian manner. Item I leave my Daughter Catherine to have one Bed & Parlor and Dressing, and one cow and calf, the Star cow, and my Lion and White Horse and Big Wheel and Cupboard & Saddle. Item I leave my Daughter Elizabeth to have my Rose horse, and ^{one} Dressing & my Saddle and Dog and one cow and calf. Item I leave that is left the Land to be Divided Equally betwixt my five Sons. Miles, Charles, John, James, and Michael is to have my Black Mare the Balance of all my property to be Divided Equally betwixt all my Children.
