Gordon - In witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed
my seal this thirteenth day of August English hundred and
Twenty Nth I do pronounce and appoint my wife Mary
Gordon Executrix

and State of Kentucky and late and indistinct in Body but sound in mind
and memory it having been appointed for all men once to die I am
desirous of my this should God in the following manner of last that is
to say after all my just and honest debts paid I Give and
bequeath unto my Loving wife Ellenor Gordon all my Real and Personal
Estate During her Natural Life I should she so long remain a widow -
that is to say an old black's man known by the name of Tom also
one old black woman by the name of Doll one Negro Girl known by
the name of Manah also six head of Horses supposed to be worth three
hundred dollars also twenty one head of cattle supposed to be worth
two hundred dollars one wagon and load supposed to be worth one
hundred and fifty dollars and all my hogs about worth as avaral
and all my money that is not an outrent for which we have
Bonds to show about twelve or thirteen hundred dollars and all
Debt that is owing to me also five Hides of a sheep and also all
my household ^{furniture} consisting of five Beds supposed to be
worth two hundred dollars also other household & children
furniture including a loom worth as is supposed fifty dollars
also four Plows two axes & four hoes supposed to be worth
twenty dollars also all my white iron and bricabrats that is on the
farm and should I have omitted naming any property belonging
to me I wish it to go to my wife and Beneficent Except my young
2 years old meat spring named Fannie I Give and bequeath to my
able Daughter Betty Carpenter the said young hoes and that
be to the use and Benefit of my before mentioned wife so long
she remains a widow should she marry the property
