and personal except the land which shall upon the
marriage or death of my daughter Panthony immediately app-
ertain to my son Whitely and his heirs forever and as
my daughters Fanny and Catharine have died without issue
they are naturally excluded from any interest in the whole
Estate with their Brothers and Sisters except one Shellen Bunch
but if my daughter Panthony remains single until her death
then Whitely is to have the land together with his part
of the dividend as before mentioned upon the death of my
daughter Panthony My negroes Nelly and the Red James shall
have them for ever the younger ones that now is a slave he
hereafter shall have their freedom at the age of twenty five
they are not to be sold out of the family if they should they
shall be immediately manumitted whereupon shall be their
purchased is hereby bound to be content to read the new testament
Be it further known that my son Robert should have the
privilege to make Sugar and the land where he has formerly
made on the South side of the path which leads to Carvers
old mill during his life he is to have the trees with an inch
Oggs and take care of the Camp but not above the
