In the name of God amen. I John Purcell of Bullitt County and state of Kentucky being sound in body and of disposing mind, but concerning the uncertainties of human life and certainty of death do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following) -

I bequeath and hereunto all my personal and real estate and all my outstanding debt unto Nathan Evans after all my just debts and funeral expenses are paid, Consisting of four hundred acres of land on Crooked Creek and fifty acres of land on the waters of Whiskey Creek: also four negroes George, Charles, James and Sophy, and the residue of my personal estate except what is hereafter mentioned, by the said Nathan Evans paying to my beloved wife Dorcas seventy five dollars every year on each of between the 25th Decr and the first day of March during her natural life; and also to feed her in good and wholesome provisions during her life time or good as the County officers: and if my wife Dorcas should decay then and in that case the said Nathan Evans is not bound to board to board her any longer: and also the said Nathan Evans is to give my wife the choice of all my horses and her own saddle and also one bed and furniture being the choice, also her choice of the room in the house wherein I now live. I also bequeath to Mary Shain an illegitimate child one bed and furniture: it is also to be understood before the said Nathan Evans is to have all of my property in his possession he is to give bond and approved security to my Executors for the faithful performance of this my will: and also is not to have

the same until he arrives to the age of twenty one years and if he cannot give good and sufficient security he is to give a mortgage on three negroes George Charles and Sophy for the conditions of this will. I also appoint William Hall as my executor in this will without security of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others I have made heretofore either verbal or written.  one weak and debilitated in body, but of sound and disposing mind and memory
 reflecting the certainty of Death and the necessity of being prepared for
 that event do make Ordain and publish this my last will and Testament to
 it; I will and bequeath my soul to God who gave it and my body to be dis-
 -posed of by my Executors: And as it respects my property and estate I do
 devise the same in the following manner: First it is my wish that all my just
 debts should be paid by my Executors out of the proceeds of my estate I will
 and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Hornbeck my negro woman Lida
 and her two children Tanny and Jears to her and her heirs forever; and I do
 also will and bequeath all the house hold and other personal property remain-
 -ing which I received with her my said wife and which may exist at the
 time of my Death and that I give her in kind of Dower in my landed
 estate It is further my will and desire that my Executors pay to my said
 wife the sum of seven hundred and eighty Dollars being the balance
 due her on marriage contract for the sale of the land which belonged
 to her in Jefferson County Kentucky. It is further my will and desire that
 my two negroes Charles and Stephen be sold and the money arising from
 the sale of them after the above purposes be answered the balance of the mo-
 -ney if any remain is to be put out by my Executors at interest for the
 use and benefit of my five infant daughters Lemina Ann Susan
 Mary Sarah Elizabeth, Catharine and Mary Jane and to be equally
 divided between them It is further my will and desire that my stock of
 horses cattle hogs and sheep and also my growing crop be sold by my
 Executors and the money arising from the sale thereof be appropriated
 as above. It is further my will and desire that all my landed estate
 should be equally divided amongst my said five daughters and that
 my house hold furniture (not hereby bequeathed to my wife) should
 be preserved for them until they respectively arrive at the age of
 twenty one year or marry, at which time such ones shall receive
 their inheritance in all my estate and no distribution is to be made to
 any one of my children until she shall arrive at the age of twenty one
 years or marry. I wish my Executors to keep my hands upon the farm
 and preserve the growing crop and others properly until the time
 of the sale. I will that my negro girl Sara Ann now about five or
 five years old should remain in the hands of my Executors until and
 when she is fit for service to be hired out and the money to be put out
 at interest for the benefit of my children, and when a division
 takes place amongst my children of the land and money of my
 Estate, the said negro girl is to go into the general division
 amongst them - It is my will and desire that all my property consist-
 -ing of farming utensils, blacksmith tools &c not otherwise
 herein disposed of be sold by my Executors, and the money
 arising from the sale of the negroes &c. I do hereby consti-
 -tute, nominate and appoint my brother in law John Hornbeck
 and my brother Preston K. Hornbeck Executors of this my
 last will and Testament, and also as Guardians to my
 said five daughters Lemina Ann Susan Mary Sarah
 Elizabeth, Catharine & Mary Jane, and it is my wish that
