In the name of God Amen. I, Stephen Bunschaw
 of Bell Co. County and State of Kentucky do make and declare
 this my last will and testament in manner and form
 following. First I resign my soul into the hands of almi-
 ghty God, hoping and believing a remission of my
 sins by the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ and my
 body I commit to the earth, to be buried at the discretion
 of my Executors, heirs or assigns named and my worldly Estate
 I give and devise as follows. First it is my desire that
 the plantation now known as Snows live should be rented
 for five years for grain by my Executors hereafter
 named payable yearly at 20 cents per year. It is
 also my desire that the rents and profits be appropriated
 to the sole use of my beloved wife Rhoda Bunschaw and
 my beloved children namely James Bunschaw, Eliza
 Bunschaw and Maria Bunschaw all to share equal
 in the rents and profits of the aforesaid rents but if
 my beloved wife before mentioned should marry before
 my aforesaid children should come to law full age
 then and such case it is my desire that she my aforesaid
 wife should take her third of all my Estate, both real
 and personal, my just debts being first paid. It is
 further my will and desire that my aforesaid wife
 should have the use of my negro woman named Bet
 and her child Calla Mary so long as she shall remain
 my widow and keep my children with her. It is also
 my desire that my negro boy named Lewis should be
 hired by the year together with the blacksmith tools
 for the economy of the State which I leave to the
 discretion of my Executors to continue there or where
 the aforesaid boy Lewis and tools provided they should
 be of opinion that a sale would be advantageous
 to my wife and children. It is further my desire
 that after my wife's death should be taken that all
 the residue of my land and personal property should
 be equally divided among all my children and

 the quantity of cleared lands in said tract
 and allotted to the said Margaret Rice, Fifty
 three and three of as follows viz The field called
 the fork field including the garden being
 23 acres The mill lot and pasture or clover
 field being 20 acres and one half of the
 meadow adjoining the below field on the west
 being four acres: Also four acres including the
 yard and buildings and part of the orchard,
 which four acres are bounded as follows. to-wit:



Beginning at A. (in the annexed plot) on the line dividing the fork fields and mill lot and pasture field, thence with a line of the said mill lot and pasture field S 28 $^{\circ}$ W 65 poles 13 links to a stake at B thence N 62 $^{\circ}$ W 16 poles 18 links to a stake in the orchard field at C, thence S 28 $^{\circ}$ East passing through the orchard to a stake at D near the spring, thence to a stake at E on a line of the fork fields with said line to a stake at F being one of the corners of said fork field thence with a line of said field to the Beginning. Of this meadow we have allotted to the said Mary and Ned a small piece of ground between the fork field and the place fork marked in the annexed plat with the words "Meadow Lane" and all that part of the meadow containing in the following terms, to wit: Beginning on McDevill's line near his back yard thence N 49 $^{\circ}$ E 6 $^{\circ}$ miles and change of the corner of the field of coches the big field, and near the north corner thence thence S 60 $^{\circ}$ E to the meadow line at the mouth of the lane to a stake, thence South 31 $^{\circ}$ W including the road leading from said lane to Shepherdville to said McDevill's land, thence with said line to the Beginning. (We have not laid down in a plat the meadow allotted to the widow living) to our next neighbor when McDevill's line runs - for an explanation of this report of the cleared lands allotted to Mr. Reed see the annexed rough plat. Retain our hands & seals this 2 nd day of July 1825.
