Kalfus two of the Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Bullitt County to settle accounts of Administrator of the estate of John Williams dec^d to state and settle his accounts as such and caused John Anderson Guardian of Samuel Williams one of the two (said Summers wife being the other) of decedent to be called before us and was present at the said settlement and proceed to state and make the same as stated and set forth in the first and second pages of this sheet and the said bill amounted to the sum of \$1018.25 Cents and the adm^r reports money on hand to the amount of \$1861.10 Cents. After deducting from the two amt. what was due from the Estate to the adm^r as may be seen by reference to a paper herewith returned marked No. 22. There being but two heirs of the Estate to wit the wife of the adm^r and

Samuel Williams, the money on hand and the sale notes was divided equally between the Admin^r and Guardian by which it will appear that the Admin^r has paid debts of the Estate to the amount of \$296.63 Cents upon the amount of the sale bill. We allowed the Admin^r 5 per Cent Court \$14.83 Cents to which add the sum above paid out by him Court \$296.63 Cents they produced the sum of \$311.47 Cents which the Admin^r has paid out of his and his wife's distributable share of the Estate And half which will be due him from the said John Anderson Guardian to Samuel Williams Vouchers A.
