Then all my Estate not above disposed of or claimed by the said Luey or my said son John I desire to be equally divided among my wife Agnes and my children Rebecca Jonathan Nancy Jonathan Betsy and Polly. Then all my lands whether claimed by me by deed of conveyance or otherwise I desire to James Caldwell & his heirs in trust for the separate use of my Daughter Sally to her & her heirs forever and to my children Nancy Jonathan Betsy and Polly and their heirs to be equally divided among all my said children. Then I desire all the land I have given to the said Caldwell one sixth part in trust for my Daughter Sally and one sixth part in trust for my Daughter Rebecca as appears to the separate use of the said children.
