for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being
desirous to dispose of such worldly estate as hath pleased God to bless me with I give
and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say I give to Elizabeth Green my
wife one third part of my real estate during her natural life after my wife's third part are
taken out I give and bequeath the balance of my land to my son Robert Green being about
seventy acres and a quarter to him and his heirs forever. I Elizabeth Green my wife's
death I give her thirds to my son Robert Green to him his heirs forever I give and bequeath
to my son George one half dollar after my just debts are paid if I have any money left
I give it to my son Robert Green this is my last Will and Testament, bearing all
these this 21st day of April 1831.
