Item I give and devise to my son Nathan Miley a Negro boy named Nace being the same boy that I had given to Sam McKim (who is now dead) and who died (without issue) to him and he and his heirs forever -

Item It is also my Will and desire that my Executors shall furnish to my said son Nathan out of good bed, bedstead and furniture which I give to him the day forever -

Item I give and devise to my daughter Polly Miley Twenty five dollars to buy her a saddle the same money to be paid out of the money arising from the sale of my personal Estate -

Item I give and devise to my daughter Sally Simmons Rose and her children Sally Sally Jane Benjamin & Charles and the further issue of said Rose and the said girl Sally to her she and her heirs forever in full of her part of my Estate - and where I have given to my daughter Nelly Miley a Negro man named Doug of the price of one hundred and twenty pounds to my daughter Elizabeth Simmons a Negro boy named Cory at the price of seventy five pounds - to my son Richard Miley her named Thomas

at the price of forty pounds. To my daughter Polly Miley a Negro boy named Sandy at the price of fifty five pounds. I therefore do set my Executors to sell to my daughter Elizabeth Simmons a Negro or Negroes at the value thereof added to the thirty five pounds shall be just to the value of the Negro given to my daughter Nelly Miley. To my son Richard Miley a Negro or Negroes so that the value thereof added to the forty pounds shall be equal to the said sum of one hundred and twenty pounds. And to my daughter Sally Miley a Negro or Negroes so that the value thereof added to the fifty five pounds shall be equal to the said sum of one hundred and twenty pounds which I give to them and their heirs forever. And he it also known that my Executors shall sell to my sons Nathan and Walter who have each received Negroes at the price of fifty five pounds a Negro or Negroes so that the value thereof shall be equal to one hundred and twenty pounds. Having heretofore given to my son Moses one hundred acres of land and two small Negroes Mariah and Daniel it is my Will and desire that the same shall be in full of any claims which he may have on my Estate as far as is hereafter mentioned.

Having also given to Joseph Brooks who married my daughter Rebecca two Negroes David Henry and Reuben at the price of one hundred and thirty pounds it is my Will and desire that said Brooks shall pay to the heirs equally whatever sum he may receive or have received above the equal share -

Item It is my Will and desire that my son Walter shall have a cow to be taken by him out of my stock of cattle -

It is also my Will and desire that my Negroes Ben & David shall be sold but shall have the liberty of choosing their masters within my own family connections.

Item It is my Will and desire that after the allotment made of the Negroes to be made by my Executors as mentioned in this Will that the balance of the Negroes and money arising from the sale of my personal property & Negroes as herein mentioned shall be divided between my children Elizabeth Simmons wife of William Simmons Nelly Miley Richard Miley Polly Miley Nathan Miley Rebecca Brooks & Walter Miley pay my son Moses five dollars out of the said money and to my daughter Sally Simmons five dollars which I give to them and their heirs forever and truly I seal this my last Will and Testament in presence of this my last Will and Testament in presence of
