 their wives and mothers. I desire that John B. Harris in
 trust in the above bequeath be sold and the sum of
 the last mentioned bequeath purchased the said bequest
 and that the purchase be made a long with Daniel
 and Nancy Harris, who are hereby appointed a
 committee for this purpose and that the said Thomas
 Harris and Nancy take the bond upon such conditions
 as will ensure them to pay the said John B. Harris the
 sum of Fifty Dollars semi-annually money annually
 on or about the 1st of May, and that they pay him the said sum
 annually or as far thereafter as it may be collected until they
 shall have paid him the whole amount of his proportional part.
 I will and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Harris and to my
 sons Thomas Harris John B. Harris and Squire Harris each an
 undivided part of a negro woman named Sally and five children
 to wit: Anne, Sarah, George, Emily & Charles to have each one
 equal interest in the said five negroes and their increase until
 they shall divide the same amongst themselves provided they
 pay the amount of the same that is due for the lot of negroes that
 I purchased by myself and Thomas Harris of John B. Harris
 and if they cannot legally divide among the heirs to whom
 they are devised then I will that they be sold and purchased
 among the heirs. I will and bequeath to my grand daughter
 Mary daughter to Nancy Harris a negro child named Viney
 about four months old. I will and bequeath to my daughter
 Nancy Harris and my three sons to wit: Thomas Harris John
 Harris and Squire Harris my undivided half of the lands of
 land called Oaklick to be equally divided between them
 or to be sold as they may agree amongst themselves
 after the youngest become of age. I will and bequeath to my
 daughters Lydia Roberts, Rachael Roberts and Nancy
 Harris and my five sons to wit: John B. Harris Thomas Harris John
 B. Harris and Squire Harris all my interest right title and
 claim to two lots in Lancaster Adams County Kentucky: and
 it is my will that if they shall be recovered that John B. Harris
 entirely should be joined to him as his interest on the first
 lot negroes hereby devised was. I will and bequeath to my
 son John B. Harris a good bed & bedding. I will and bequeath
 to my daughter Nancy Harris and my sons Thomas Harris John
 B. Harris and Squire Harris two good horses and furniture each.
 and I will that my son Squire Harris have my best coat
 and curtains. I will and bequeath to my six grand daugh-
 ters Charlotte Summons, Ann Maria Summons each fifty
 dollar worth of new hosiery garments such as the rest of the
 heirs may agree to give them; and I intend them to have it
 at its valuation in command of the money. I will and
 bequeath that all the personal property that I have acquired
 from the death of my husband William Harris not hereby
 otherwise disposed of be equally divided between my

four children Nancy Harris Thomas Harris John B. Harris
 and Squire Harris: but it is my will that my just debt be
 first paid before any of the property hereby devised be dis-
 posed of. I hereby constitute above appointed Thomas Harris
 John B. Harris and Thomas M. Harris my executors of this
 my last will and testament. Given under my hand
 and seal this 5 day of May 1825.
