The last Will and testament of Moses Moore deceased in perfect health and sound judgement of mind But considering the uncertainty of all things do make this my last Will and testament

First I bequeath my sole to God who gave it and my body to the dust from whence it came

Second my will is that my funeral Expence be paid and all other last debts or demands against me— Third I give and bequeath to my Brothers Samuel David Seth and Isaac a tract of land on Floyd's fork of the River hundred acres to be equally divided among them— Fourth I give and bequeath to my Brother John all the residue of my other land either in Kentucky or elsewhere Bought in partnership or other wise, and do further make him my lawful heir of all my personal or private either in property Books and papers or of any sort Fifthly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Brother John Moore my whole and sole executor of this my last will and testament and also do hereby make all former wills made by me whatever and Testimony hereof have hereunto set my hand and seal this 29th of October the thousand eight hundred and twenty four 1794
