in perfect minds do make and ordain this my last will and
testament in the form following that is to say: I Give my so ve-
lent to the Land of Kentucky God, that gave it and my body free co-
mmissioned to the Earth to be freely intend &ly the execution
of my Executors and as touching my worldly Estate which is both
personal good to beg me with. I Give and bequeath in the manner and
form following that is to say forth of all my lawful debts to his people
I desire and will that that my Plantation that I live as is to
be given to my Daughter Elizabeth her life time and then to be sold
and Equally divided amongst my four Daughters that is to say e Mary &
Barbery and Margaret. I also will that my Daughter Elizabeth shall
be paid in full possession of all my other personal household furniture &c
pieces and Linen apiece. I Give also bequeath to my true friend one
Hundred acres of Land adjoining to my Plantation to him and
his heirs &c. I desire my son Peter Gunterman and son George
Gunterman to be Executors to my Estate he and signed &
Witnessed in presence of us the 2^d day of November 1873
