Item I give and devise to my son Samuel the tract of land lying at the corner of the back containing thirty two and half acres of land also a part of the tract whereon I now live and a part of the tract I bought of Montmar, lately surveyed by Ben Shumbery beginning at the corner of the above tract bought of Ben Richards thence down the main road leading Shepherdsville, thence to a corner made in the tract of land whereon I now live is a hollow, on the side of the road, from thence to a corner upon an knob being a part of a tract bought of Montmar, this side of Jacob Wells house, from thence to a corner on the side of Montmar's mill road, and from thence with Richards' line to the beginning the above divided two tracts of land to the said Samuel his heirs and assigns forever.
