my heirs after my death. Item I give and bequeath unto my
wife Asahel Stiles and her two sons James Stiles and Joseph Stiles
all my lands and tenements to be equally divided between them
and after the death of Asahel Stiles then the third part of
my land now falling to him shall be left by her to my young
est daughter Mary Stiles - also all my plantations eternally
goods and stocks and household furniture to be held in property
- given by her the said Asahel Stiles to and disposed
of to the best advantage towards the education of my children
and finishing my house this shall continue so long as the
the said Asahel Stiles shall remain my widow but if she
should marry then she the said Asahel Stiles shall hold
her lawful third of the property and the balance to be
equally divided between the three above mentioned children
and the said Asahel Stiles shall rent out the plantation where
she now lives or any part thereof as she thinks proper
and the rent to be disposed of to the best advantage
towards the support of herself & my children In Witness
