I Edmund Stinger son of Abigail Stinger and late of Kentucky, being aged and weak in body, but thanks to god of sound mind and memory, and knowing the uncertainty of life do think fit so to dispose of the property which god in his providence has given me, as shall be satisfactory to me and which I do in the following manner To wit: First after having bound up my soul to god whosoever it, and my body buried as my friends may think fit. I will that my negro woman Sylvia shall have her freedom after my death agreeable to our Instrument of writing which I gave her bearing date the 31st day of March 1821. It is my Will that my negro man Will shall be held out until he shall raise by his hire the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars, and after he shall have so raised the sum aforesaid he is to have his freedom, and is no longer to be held in bondage by any of my heirs or any other person or persons whatsoever. It is my Will that my negro woman Charlotte shall be held out until she shall by Raisin by her hire the sum of three hundred dollars, and after she shall so have raised the sum aforesaid she is to have her freedom and is no longer to be held in bondage by any of my heirs or any other person or persons whatsoever, and in case the said negro woman Charlotte shall have a child or children after my death and before the time of her freedom and child or children are not to be held in bondage, but are to be free to all intents and purposes. The said negro man is not to be held so as to go out of his neighborhood without their consent. The said negro man is to be clothed by my legatee if they shall choose to do so. If not they are to be clothed out of the money arising from their hire. Which is to be included in the sum of money which they are bound to raise. It is my Will that my two negro children Robert Mary & Elizabeth shall serve my son in Law John Davis and his wife Persimach until the age of twenty years, and after they shall so arrive until the age of twenty years, and after they shall have arrived to the age of twenty years, It is my Will that they shall have their freedom and no longer be

held in bondage. The hire of the above negro Robert Child, Charlotte, Mary and Elizabeth to be equally divided between my eight children or their heirs Robert John Stinger, William Stinger, Thomas Stinger, Sally, Miller, Mary Stinger, Persimach Davis, Mary Stinger, and the bodily hire of Peter Miller and in his stead, except that the said negro man is to be clothed by my legatee if they choose, if not out of their hire. Which is to be bounded as part of the sum, that they are to raise, also all my personal estate of every description to be equally divided between my children or their heirs, except that they are all to be made equal, first in the property that they have already had, that is, those that have had a life, then the others, is to be made equal before distribution is made. I do here revoke and set aside all former Wills made by me, and declare this only to be my last Will and Testament. In testimony Whereof I have set my hand and seal this 4th day of June 1821. It is my Will that my negro man Will shall have and my wife all the property and money which I have permitted them to gather, and they are to enjoy the same as their own free right.
