

including the dwelling house in which the decedent resided at the time of his death - For the Censes and distances of the whole tract, and the Censes and distances of the 81 Acres allotted to M^r Pope for land, we refer to the Survey of said Decedent signed by himself & dated the 7th day of November 1834 also hereto attached as a part of this report - We then proceeded to allot M^r Pope her share in the slaves of the estate of Benjamin Pope deceased the whole number of slaves, their ages and valuations being as follows, to wit:

On this arrangement M^r Pope will be indebted to the heirs this sum of \$1158.66

We could not find any number of the negroes that were equal in value to one third of the whole amount of valuations, and were therefore constrained in the allotment to leave a balance for one party or the other to be paid in money. All my Estate real and personal to be equally divided between them, and to them and their heirs forever except Ten dollars which I will and bequeath to my nephew William B. Summers to purchase a ring of remembrance. I further wish him to have fixed in said ring some of my hair together with some of his mother's. It is my will and desire that my negro man Andrew shall be purchased by some one of the family of my sister Melinda Summers living in this State. It is my will that I have on hand or Matthew Wilson I will and bequeath to Mary Wilson and Sarah Wilson
