In the name of god amen I Solomon Cornell of this county of Bullitt and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of a perfect sound mind and memory blessed be almighty god do hereby publish this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following that is to say after all my lawfull debts is paid I give and bequeath unto Sarah Buel my oldest daughter ten Dollars in trade at its real Value I bequeath unto my daughter Merabab Roper fifteen pounds in trade at its real Value I bequeath unto my two grand Daughters Jane Cornell & Hannah Cornell sixteen dollars in trade at its real Value to be divided between them I give unto Charit Russell fifty cents also I bequeath unto my daughter Mary McRae fifty cents - I bequeath unto my daughter Phoebe the negro girl named Rachel I also bequeath unto my daughter Phoebe and Polly the negro woman named Sarah and her child by the name of Tom to be equally divided between them also a man named Rigous between them equal I bequeath unto my son Solomon Cornell that part of my land beginning at Davis Halls lane and running with a line made by said David Hall & John Glaser in the house he now lives in so on to the

line also I give him one third of the line of my negro man Tom I give and bequeath unto my son Jacob Cornell the plantation on which I now live and all the farming utensils & negroes on the same named Samie I wish my beloved wife Elizabeth Cornell to have a sufficient living of the place and property all my stock and household furniture & negroes and live stock of the time of my negro man Tom during her natural life and at her death my son Solomon Cornell the negro man Tom for his share probably I bequeath unto my son William Cornell ten dollars in property at its real Value I hereby appoint David Hall and Jesse Drake Executors of this my last Will & Testament
