It is my desire my executors hereafter named will hire my negro man Peter to some fit person until he earns three hundred dollars should he live so long and then to obtain his freedom which money is to be applied in discharging of my debts if any thing should be: also my negro boy named Ned to be hired to some fit person until he is thirty years old if he should live so long and then to obtain his freedom, after paying, all my just debts and expenses that shall arise in transacting the business respecting this my last will, the proceeds that shall arise from the hire of the two negro boys Peter and Ned, if any there should be to be disposed of in the following manner that is to say Nancy Gilheart two parts, Elizabeth Runch two parts, Eliza Martin two parts, Leary White one part. I do hereby nominate and appoint my son-in-law Thomas J. Martin and Jonathan R. P. Raccoh my executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all former and other wills by me heretofore made.

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal in Bullitt county Kentucky this first day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five.
