Item I give and devise to my son Jonathan the balance of the tract where I now live, also a part of the tract of land bought of Montmar lately surveyed by Ben Humphrey beginning at a corner on a tract near Jacob Wells, thence to a corner on Ben Pope's line, thence to a corner of the tract where I now live, from thence to the line of the tract where I live until it intersects Montmar's line is a hollow, and from thence to the beginning to him the said Jonathan and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and devise to my son William the balance of the tract of land I bought of Montmar to him the said William and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my dear wife Tabitha the following negroes namely: El. Betty, Hendra also two hens the choice of my flock, a saddle & bridle a bed and furniture two cows and calves, three sheep a plow and gear, two axes, two barrels my kitchen and table furniture fifteen hundred weight of pork two sows and three pigs and two hogs, and one third part of the crop I may have at hand at my decease. In May to her the said Tabitha during her widowhood.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Tabitha the three following negroes namely: Sam John and Ben three cows and calves, a bed and furniture three sheep one sow and her pigs to her the said Tabitha and her assigns and her pigs to her the said Tabitha and her assigns and Samuel a bed and furniture a cow half three sheep a sow I give him some time ago, called Rex, a sow and her pigs to him the said Samuel his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William a mare I give him some time ago, called Amy, a bed and furniture a cow half three sheep a sow, and her pigs to him the said William his heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Jonathan a mare called staves a bed and furniture a cow half three sheep a sow, and her pigs to him the said Jonathan his heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath all the rest residue of my estate to be equally divided among my sons Joseph, Richard, Samuel, William & Jonathan, and Humphrey & Nancy children of my son Griffin deceased to have a child's part equally divided among them, and my daughters Nancy, Susan, Belinda, Polly and Tabitha, To them, Joseph, Richard, Samuel, William, Jonathan, and Humphrey & Nancy children of my son Griffin, Nancy, Susan, Belinda, Polly & Tabitha their heirs and assigns forever.

and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my dear wife Tabitha to be executrix, and my son Samuel to be Executor of this my last will and testament revoking and annulling all former wills by me heretofore made ratifying, approving, this and none other to be my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand ratified my seal this fifteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and nine.
