I will unto my daughter Elizabeth one Horse that she has red. worth about thirty Dollars also do Will on to my son Daniel one Horse with a Carriage and worth about the same amount and as the rest of the children leave her my Wife if she can with convenience to give them about the same amount the Balance of the property after all debts are paid and this property above mentioned received the balance is to remain in the hands of my Wife until the youngest child doth come of full age except one child and middle which I leave unto my son Laneford at fifteen Dollars and then after he my Wife receiving her third the balance to be equally divided between all my children It is my Will that Joseph Malabar will manage for her in any business that she shall wish him to do - This being my last Will and testimony in the year of our Lord 1874 the 14th day of March 1874 Thomas Baker
