This term & then fourth term. Given under our hands this 15th day of January 1816.

Ordered that Austin Hall, Elizabeth Wright & David Drake be appointed Commissioners to allot to Elizabeth Reel widow and relict of Thomas Reel died her dower in the slaves of the said deceased and that the said Commissioners or any two of them being first sworn do make such allotment and return the same to the next Court.

Bullitt County Ct. This day Austin Hall and David Drake two of the within named Commissioners may duly sworn before me a Justice of the peace for the purpose within mentioned in this order. Given under my hands this 29th day of December 1815 Clifton Hall J.P. 1816.

In Obedience to an order of the Honorable County Court of Bullitt County appointing us the undersigned Commissioners to allot unto Elizabeth Reel widow and relict of Thomas Reel deceased her dower of the slaves of which the said Thomas Reel died seized and possessed have proceeded to make such allotment and have given unto the said Elizabeth Reel a negro man named Moses which we conceive to be one third of the value of said slaves. Given under our hands this 29th day of December 1815

This day Austin Hall and David Drake may duly sworn before me a Justice of the peace in and for the County of Bullitt as Commissioners to divide the lands of Enock Allison and Betsey Barbary Hoskins formerly Allison & Hoskins given from under my hand this 29th day of Dec 1815 Clifton Hall J.P. 1816.

In Obedience to an order of the County Court of Bullitt County we your Commissioners appointed for the purpose of making division of the lands of which Enock Allison and his wife Betsey and her heirs Betsey Barbary Hoskins formerly Allison and Enock Allison widow and relict of said deceased and said Barbary Hoskins claiming under the will of the said Enock and the widow claiming her right of dower in said lands. We having been duly sworn have proceeded to make division of said lands having taken into consideration the quality as well as the convenience & convenience attending the same have allotted unto Barbary Hoskins thirty acres and the lower end of the tract and bounded as follows. Beginning at a small hony locust corner to Mrs Allison's land, thence containing the corner of her line N 50° E 132 poles to two benches and a sugar tree, thence up a run N 65° E 34 poles, thence at 42° E 56 poles to a blacky corner on the top of the hill at a cedar - thence with his line and boundary on the top of the hill S 61° E 8 poles, thence South 20° W 40 poles, thence S 65° E 24 poles, thence N 65° E 12 poles, thence S 15° E 24 poles, thence N 84° E 14 poles, thence at 65° E 20 poles, thence S 5° E 26 poles to Mrs Allison's corner - thence with her line S 47° W 53 poles to the Beginning.

We have also allotted unto Susanna Allison 145 acres of the said lands, being the upper end of the said tract and bounded as follows. Beginning at two benches the upper corner of the Original Survey on the river, thence down the same S 16° W 44 poles, S 18° 94 poles, to a bench, thence N 50° W 118 poles to a small hony locust, thence at 47° E 53 poles to a blacky line, on the hill, thence with the same N 82° E 30 poles, thence at 19° E 36 poles to a blacky corner in Hawthorn's upper line, thence with the same S 50° E 28 poles to the Beginning. Which two tracts of land we consider to be equal in point of value as the nature and situation of the land will admit of in testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands this 29th day of December 1815 Austin Hall David R Drake
