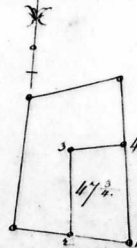

I Thomas Saunders of Bullitt County and State of Kentucky being aged and of sound mind calling to mind the uncertainty of life and the necessity of equitably disposing of that property which it hath pleased God to bless me with. He made and ordained this my last Will and Testament as follows. In the first place it is my will and desire that my regular hereinafter named shall cause me to be buried in a decent plain manner. 2nd I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary Saunders during her life the one third part of my negroes and personal property of every description to be allotted to her after the inventory and appraisement shall have been made and the same during her life also on which I now live being that part which will be herein after devised to my son John W. Saunders with liberty to her to take from the woodland a sufficient of fire wood and timber necessary to keep the house and fires in repair. 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Harriet Saunders Twenty five acres of land part of my five hundred and back lying in Bullitt County on the waters of Indian Creek and bounded as laid off by William Carrall as follows. Beginning at a apple tree and two beeches one of the original corners thence North 20° West 218 poles to a stone near Joseph Saunders place in the big road thence South 70° West 83 poles to a rock marked H. S. in the pasture of Joseph Saunders Jr thence South 20° East 218 poles to a stone marked H. S. near Sawways Shop in the original line thence with said line North 70° East 83 poles to the Beginning. to him and his heirs forever. 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah (now) wife of John W. and to the heirs of her body forever two hundred and fifty five acres of land part of my said 500 acre tract and bounded as follows. Beginning at a small ash and stone marked W. in the original line thence North Twenty poles to her red buds and a dogwood in Harriet Saunders line thence with her line North 20° West 31 poles to a rock marked H. S. in a pasture of Thomas Saunders Jr thence South 70° West 83 poles to a stone in a field near an old house thence South 20° West 260 poles to two sweet gums white oak and Sassafras in the original line thence with the same South 70° West 83 poles to a white oak ash and elm in a large flat thence South 20° East 296 poles to the Beginning. If the said John W. and shall cut live my said daughter Sarah he is only to have a life Estate in said Land and after his death the said land is to descend to the children of my said daughter Sarah if there should be any alive at the time of his death and if not then to my daughter Harriet John W. Saunders Joseph Saunders Jr and the children of George Saunders and their heirs forever. 5th My son Joseph Saunders Jr having sold to my son John W. Saunders his interest in the said five hundred and back I now devise to my son John W. Saunders One hundred and thirty five acres being the same land which is devised to my wife Mary during her life and which is bounded as follows. Beginning at three elm stumps and a stone the original beginning corner of said five hundred acre tract thence with a line thence North 20° West 181 poles to a small ash and stone marked W. thence North 70° East 111 poles to her red buds and a dogwood in Harriet Saunders line thence with her said line South 20° East 181 poles to a stone marked H. S. near Sawways Shop in the original line thence with said line South 70° West 111 poles to the Beginning to him and his heirs forever. 6th The Land hereby devised to Harriet Saunders and Sarah (now) and John W. Saunders having been valued by Samuel Wrenbold and others Trust The Land of Harriet Saunders to Second Dollars per acre and the Land of Sarah (now) to First Dollars per acre and the Land of John W. Saunders to Third Dollars per acre and not having given any Land to him.
