 Bullitt County of the Commonwealth of Kentucky do make my
 Last Will and Testament in manner and form following
 Knowing all other and former Wills by me made. In the first place
 I will that my negro man Ben be hired out at private sale until
 my just debt are paid and at the expiration of which he is to be
 paid. Secondly I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sally
 Simmons my farm containing one hundred acre of land lying
 in the bend of a salt river together with all my household furniture
 and personal property. Thirdly I will that my negro boy
 Isaac and likewise my negro girl Sally remain in the possession
 of my wife until they are twenty five years of age and at the
 expiration of so term they are to be set free.

Lastly I do hereby appoint my Brother James Simmons Executor of
 this my Last Will and Testament. In testimony whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal in the presence
 of three Witnesses this 20th of Oct. 1822
