In obedience to an Order of the Honorable County Court of Bullitt to us directed by the undersigned Commissioners did on the 10th day of October 1831 proceed to lay off by actual survey the down of Amos Auld widow of Joseph Auld dec^d in a tract of Land lying in Bullitt County on West run containing 30 1/2 acres now in the occupation of Levi Magruder and Mrs Sarah Handcock giving to the said Amos Auld one third of the improved Land and the one third part of the unimproved Land containing the same according to the quality and value thereof. The courses and distances of the 30 1/2 acres are above mentioned by beginning at two white oaks and running thence S. 1/2° E. 12 poles to a gum and hickory thence S. 1/2° E. 20 poles to a poplar tree white oaks thence N. 1/2° E. 1/2 poles to a poplar thence N. 1/2° E. 1/2 poles to a white oak in a line thence N. 1/2° E. 127 poles to a stone in a place marked RR thence N. 21° E. 20 poles to a stone and mulberry thence N. 32° E. 220 poles to a spruce and elm on the East line of Bullitt run thence northward and thence to the beginning.
