First and principally I give my soul into the hands of god who gave it me, leaving in the hands of my various & Redeemer Jesus Christ for pardon & purification of my sins at the last day, I give my body to the faith to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named, and as touching such worldly goods wherewith I am possessed I have planned good always god, to bless my soul in this life, I give devise & bequeath in manner and form following to wit

Item I give to my beloved wife Sarah my the plantation where we now live and two hundred dollars to be paid by my Executors, and one cow and calf and one riding horse, four breeding cows, leather bed and furniture.

Item to my son better my share given 200 acres of land, one negro girl & the name of her one riding horse.

Item to my son Alexander I give one hundred and twenty five acres of land where he now lives, one negro boy by the name of Bob, & 1 riding horse.

Item to my son Valentine my I give one hundred and twenty five acres of land, where he now lives one negro girl named Nancy and 1 riding horse.

Item to my son William my I give one hundred and twenty five acres of land, where he and wife Margaret now live, one and one riding horse.

Item to my son John my I give one hundred and twenty five acres of land, the exact number of acres of land, which land he sold to George Spencer one negro boy by the name of Tom one riding horse.

Item I give to my son Daniel my one hundred and twenty five acres of land, it being the same that I gave to my son John one negro girl by the name of Mary, for the proper use of him this being given to him.

Item I give to my son William my the same land I have given to his mother containing one hundred and twenty five acres after he dies the same to be for one negro girl named a slave, one riding horse.

Item to the children of my daughter Maria Ann Birmingham (last number seven) I give one hundred and fifty acres of land whereon he now lives having his natural life and after his death the said land shall be sold to the highest bidder for 12 months bid, and the money divided between the seven children born of my daughter Maria Ann Birmingham & my daughter Polly equally.

Item to my daughter Mary holding two hundred acres of land one negro girl named Liza, one riding horse and one half bred horse.

Item to my daughter Mary Ann, I give one negro girl named Liza and two hundred dollars to be paid by my Executors one riding horse.

Item to my youngest daughter Polly my one negro girl by the name of Milly, one negro girl by the name of Lancelot, four breeding cows, one riding horse, two breeding cows.

from the last. To my grand son Reids King being the son of Reids King twenty dollars and no more - and to my grand daughter Sally the being the daughter of Alexander King. I give twenty dollars - both of which legacies to be paid by my Executors.

And it is my Will that within four months after my death the whole of my estate that is not bequeathed shall be sold by my Executors after advertising in the Providence paper now printed - four times. The property not bequeathed are as follows. My own house, well, Charles and Allen. Horses, cattle, hogs sheep, henns - hold and kitchen furniture, plantations utensils &c and the money arising from the sale after the legacies being paid shall be equally divided between my children to wit. Reids King, Alexander King, Valentine King, Nelson King, John King, Saml King, William King, and my daughter to wit. Levis Caldwell, & Polly King

I do hereby bequeath to my son John King and my son Saml King as my Executors. Reids King this two others to be my last Will and testament. I do bequeath after my death hand and seal the twenty first day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen
