And the name of God amen I Mr. Overalls of Bullitt County and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be almighty God for the Lord do witness and publish this my last will and testament

in manner and form as following that is to say First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anne Overalls One Negro girl named Julia who with her offspring at my wife's death to be equally divided between the children I have by and my wife. I also give unto my eldest Daughter Frances one negro girl named also one horse worth thirty pounds in trade one cow and calf and one father bed, also one Saddle and bridle. I do give also unto my Daughter Catharine one negro named Peter one horse worth thirty pounds in trade Saddle and bridle. one cow and calf and father bed I do also give unto my son John one negro boy named Laman one horse Saddle and bridle worth thirty pounds. I do also give unto my wife Ann all my lands lying in Bullitt and Nelson Counties during her life and all the rest of my Estate both real and personal - should and at her death my son William or when he comes to age it to have a negro of the increase of either Live or Chattels. also a horse Saddle and bridle and should my wife be delivered of a child and it should live to become of age I wish that child to have a negro of the increase of either if any and if neither of the negroes have issue I wish William and the after mentioned child to receive as much more in land or money arising from the sale of the Estate at my wife's death as will amount to the value of the Legacy left to either of the children and I wish the lands at her death to her share equally the balance of moveable property to be sold and the money equally divided among the children and I do appoint my wife Ann and Mr. J. Halbert Executors to see this my last will and testament fully executed according to the true tenor thereof signed and dated this fourteenth day of June in the year of our Lord 1810
