I William Lashbrook of Bullock County and state of Kentucky, being weak in body but of sound and perfect mind bearing witness that I am nearly 70 years of age for the same. do make and publish this my last will and testament manner & form following. My first of all I forgive all my just debts and funeral charges be paid and satisfied. Then my whole estate being now in my own possession. I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Ely Lashbrook, during her natural life (widow) a tract or parcel of land containing sixty seven acres. situated lying on Myers fork in the County and state aforesaid and joining Williams Whittles Land, on the lower side, which land I bought of Williams Ork Thompson, and do hereby give and bequeath the same to my youngest son George Lashbrook, after my decease, as his own right and property. forever observing his mother is to live on the land and draw her support during her natural life or widowhood, the share of the profits, that I give unto my wife Ely Lashbrook to return to my son George Lashbrook at the decease of my wife to him and his heirs forever, except the same I shall hereafter mention. I give & bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Lashbrook now living with me, one feather bed and furniture, Cow 1 back, one grey mare, three hells, at her Mother's death. Two pewter plates, one dish two Basons, and one spinning wheel. these things I give to her at my decease. I give unto my son Samuel Lashbrook one feather bed and furniture. I give unto my four sons and two daughters each one of what I have before given them, one dollar for piece, namely John Lashbrook, William Lashbrook, James Lashbrook, & Thomas Lashbrook, Elizabeth Stewart & Jane Matthews. I also appoint my beloved wife Ely Lashbrook sole executrix of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills, & one this 23^d day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen
