On the motion of John Hume administrator of the estate of James William deid ordered that Archibald Main, Jacob Hume and Jonathan Greathears being just persons do appraise in current money the personal estate and Haves of say of which the said William deid Reside and possessed and that they return an inventory thereof to the next Court

This day Archibald Main, Jonathan Greathears and Jacob Hume took the Oaths prescribed by law before me a Justice of the Peace for said County to appraise the estate of James William deid agreeable to the Written Order. Given under my hand this 17th day of May 1876
