In the name of God Amen I Alexander Turner of the County of Campbell & State of Kentucky, being in a low state of health but perfect in mind. I memory best calling to mind the frailty of mortals & that all have to die & as to touching such things as it hath pleased God to bequeath with in this world I wish to dispose of in the following manner to wit

First I leave to my Brother Reuben Turner one half of my land that is due me for services rendered in the United States War when at War with Great Britain also one half of the money that is due me as a pension from the United States of America also one half of all my other monies due me in Virginia and all & every of the other half I leave to my sister Julia Turner for her to have & enjoy as soon as it can be collected In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 14th day of July 1817

 which sooner shall last happen I intend to be paid him from
 one year after the decease above mentioned my Daughter
 Sarah M. Pike one dollar my Daughter Sarah Smith her choice
 cow which I shall die before off the balance of my estate with
 in land which I own being part of the tract of 385 Acres
 purchased of David Smith being a tract of 87 Acres or in cattle
 horses hogs & all kind of house hold Furniture clothing and
 bedding Debt or any other property that I may die before
 equal share & share alike to my three Daughters Emily
 Elizabeth & Hester Lindsey & to their heirs if either
 of them should die before marriage her share to go the
 survivors & in case my wife should out live me it shall
 be in her power to give their share to either of the said Emily
 Elizabeth or Hester Lindsey I leave my sons Thomas & John Lindsey's
 Executors of this my last Will & Testament revoking all others
 given under my hand & seal this 13th day of Aug. 1817
