William Stephens of Campbell County Kentucky being of sound mind & memory but in a low state of health & convinced that all men must die do hereby make & declare this my last Will & Testament in manner & form as follows, namely, I give & bequeath my soul to God who gave it & my body to the dust from whence it was taken to be buried in decent Christian burial hoping & trusting that both will be united again at the day of resurrection, I call my worldly goods & possessions I give & bequeath as follows - I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Rebecca Morgan one feather bed bedstead & bed furniture complete one cow & calf one side saddle which she now possesses one horse & two sheep if a live at my decease & after my decease & my wife Elizabeths decease one small Bearon - I give & bequeath all my goods & Land except as a above mentioned I give & bequeath of to my wife Elizabeth for her use & behoof during her natural life and after her death, I will that what ever may remain may & shall be equally divided & divided amongst my children Wm. John R. Stevens George G. Stevens Wm. D. Stevens Polly Morgan Edward Stevens James Stevens Martin Stevens Samuel Stevens & Joseph Stevens & it is my Will & Wish that if I die before my said Wife Elizabeth, that the Land & such things as she may see proper shall be sold to the best advantage by my executors but it is to be understood that the profits arising therefrom shall be for the use of my said Wife during her life time as before mentioned. And I do hereby appoint & ordain my sons William D.
