The Last Will and Testament of Frederick Hottle of Campbell County & State of Kentucky

In the name of God Amen Frederick Hottle being of sound mind and memory but weak in body - knowing that all men must die I do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in the following manner I do

First I give my soul to God who gave it and my Body to the dust from whence it was taken to be buried in the Christian Burial hoping and trusting that it will be raised again at the last day -

Secondly after all my just debts are paid I give and bequeath my worldly estate real and personal as follows

1st I give and bequeath all my land wherever now lies (and which I purchased by Mr John Winstan to my sons Lewis Frederick John Henry and Thomas to be equally divided among them after my death but not until my youngest surviving son arrives at the age of twenty one years, to them and their heirs forever

2^d I give and bequeath to my son Frederick Hottle one Negro man named Sere besides his equal share of the rest

3^d I give and bequeath unto my sons Lewis Frederick John Henry and Thomas, my daughters Polly Elanna and Pekar a Negro man named Jacob and a Negro woman named Nona and her children to be equally divided among them when my youngest son arrives at the age of twenty one years

4th I give and bequeath unto my son Lewis Hottle and my daughter Polly Hottle each a feather bed and furniture which they have now at their possession as also a feather bed and furniture to my daughter Eleanor which is now called bed

5th I give and bequeath unto my son Frederick Hottle one bay mare named Sallie all her mare and colts and one of his horses with the rest of my children to the only use of him and his heirs and assigns forever -

6th And lastly I give and bequeath all the estate of home and Cattle & which I may die possessed of together with all my house and furniture farming implements and all other property not mentioned above unto all my children to be equally divided among them, to the said Lewis Hottle that my daughter Mary who married Benjamin Hottle and her heirs are excepted as I give her the portion I settled her before, I hereby appoint my son Frederick Hottle and John Hottle my heirs executor and declare that in my last will and Testament discharging and a working away and as often with whatever by me made
