of June 1796 I Hugh Swan of the Town of Newport
State of Kentucky (person being very sick and weak of
body but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given
unto God. therefore calling unto mind the Mortality of
my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men
Once to die do make and Ordain this my last will
and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all
I give and Recommend my Soul unto the hands of almighty
God who gave it. and my Body I recommend to the Earth
to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of
my Executors not doubting but at the General Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the almighty power of
God. And as touching such worldly Estate whereunto
hath pleased God to bless me in this life:—
I give and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form
I give and bequeath to my Daughter

a certain Three Acres out Lott in the Town of Newport
a adjacent thereto Known in the plan of said by Lott M. Tucker
Also to I give unto my eld^r Daughter Jane. a certain French
Iron bound. Together with all my wearing apparel, Together
with all my out standing debts of whatsoever Nature whatever
also a Tickettle pot. Bake oven. Pot Framel. Paster and Selp
Ware. One two point Indian blanket. -

Item I give to my wife beloved Daughter, Martha my
Feather bed. under bed. and bedding. Two Iron Pots now
in her possession. also Ten pounds, in Cash to be paid
by Jacob Barnackman and William Reddock either
of them, in currency of the state of Kentucky. on the sixth
day of June 1798. whom I likewise constitute and
ordain my sole Executors of this my last Will and Testam
ent

And I do hereby utterly disallow Revokes, and
annull all and every other Testament, will, Legacies,
and bequeaths, and Executors by me in any way before
named wills, and bequeaths ratifying and confirm-
ing. this and no other to be my last Will and Testa-
ment.
