

Know all men by these presents that I Jacob (Jesse) being
 now low in health, but of sound mind and memory and
 knowing the uncertainty of life and that it is appointed
 all men once to die: do make and execute this my
 last Will and Testament: touching things in this
 world which it hath pleased God to bestow upon me
 First - After paying all my just debts and funeral
 charges, I give and bequeath unto (my) loving wife
 Deborah the whole of my plantation with the improve-
 ments on the same for her use and the support of
 our children, namely Lucina Florinda and our son
 Joseph (who is low in health and requires great care to
 restore him: and attention to his education) during
 her natural life, and when it shall please God to take
 her from this life, my Will is that my said plan-
 tation be divided between my children Lucina -
 Florinda and Joseph and daughter Sarah Robinson
 in manner following (Viz) That part of said plan-
 tation included between the line supposed to be
 continued to the line marked on the plat or map
 S 46 E - 66. 60 and all the land included between the
 said line the River Ohio and the line dividing it
 from Andersons land, until it intersects a division
 line marked also on the said map or plat S 47 E to
 be the sole property of our son Joseph: but in case he
 die without an heir or issue of his body then the said property
 to revert to his sisters above named: share and share alike
 equitably and fairly to be divided between them according to the
 true interest meaning hereof

Also - I hereby give and bequeath unto my daughter
 Lucina all that certain part of said plantation
 lying between the same as it now runs and the line
 dividing it from the land of Mass Vickers and
 R. Goddards land, excepting twenty acres to be laid off
 including the large spring near the line marked on the plat of
 S 46: 15 E and S 46: 25 N to be added to the part of my
 daughter Florinda to whom I hereby give and bequeath all
 the adjoining land with the said twenty acres of land
 except the two mills and thirty acres of land lying

on the run leading to widow Chennymakers which is
 reserved to be sold and it is my will that my executors do
 sell the same to the best advantage and to apply the proceeds
 thereof to the support of my children and their education at
 the discretion of their mother.

In like manner I will and bequeath to my daughter
 Sally Robinson that certain piece of land bounded on
 the Ohio River twenty chains and a thirty chains being
 further designated on the plat aforesaid by the dividing
 lines at 46 N. 55. 25 and S 45 N until it comes in
 and make up about one hundred acres

And I declare my will, that in case my daughter
 Sally Robinson should die and leaving no issue
 of her body that one third part of the said one
 hundred acres or what may be valued an
 equivalent thereto shall become the sole property
 of her husband James Robinson, the remaining
 two thirds to revert to, and be equally divided
 among the surviving children before named
 It is my will that in case of the death of any
 one or more of my children leaving no issue of
 their bodies that the property bequeathed as above
 stated shall revert to and be divided share and
 share alike among the surviving sisters and
 their brother Joseph aforesaid

It is likewise my will that each of my children as before named
 shall have and thereby bequeath to each of them two good
 feather beds with good bedding and furniture also a good
 riding horse with saddle and bridle to each of my daughters
 if provided I give to each of my sisters namely Alice Allen
 Patience Smith and Ann Byls fifty dollars Rachel
 Leaveland having received the like sum heretofore -
 Lastly - I do hereby constitute make and appoint
 my loving wife Deborah (Jesse) William Vickers
 and Sarah Robinson the executors of this
 my last Will and Testament
