Second I do will and bequeath to my beloved wife Jane one third of all my personal Estate to be Enjoyed by my Executors during her life.

Thirdly I do will to my son James Armstrong ^{one equal} Moiety of my Tract of one Hundred and Seventy eight Aers of land and one Sorel Mare Colt known by the name of James's Colt

Fourthly I do will to my son John Armstrong one Equal Moiety of my tract of One Hundred Seventy eight Aers of land and one Sorel Mare Colt known by John's Colt

Fifthly I do give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Elizabeth one Cow known by Betsey's Cow

Sixthly I do give and bequeath to John Armstrong Tawer one Horse to be worth Twenty pounds to be paid him by my sons James and John Armstrong out of their proportion of the estate when the said John Armstrong Tawer shall amount to the age of Ten years old.

Seventhly It is my wish that my son James Armstrong may have full possession of his part of my land at the age of Nineteen years old untill which time his mother is to have her

Equal thirds of his proportion of the plantation for her the Support the ballance of Two thirds of the profits of his proportion of plantation is to be considered his from this date

Eighthly it is my wish that my son John Armstrong may have his proportion in manner and form a bow

Ninthly the Ballance of my personal Estate meaning my Stock Household furniture money due me &c To be equally Divided between my three Children James John and Elizabeth at the discretion of my Executors

Lastly I do appoint my Trusty Friends Jane Armstrong and my son James Armstrong Executors to this my last Will and Testament Including this my last will & Testament.

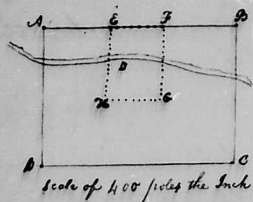

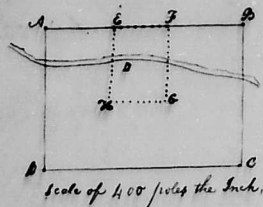
