

made for her support and that they duly appropriate the proceeds or interest of said funds for her the said Sally P. Green's support and maintenance. It is further my will and desire that after the death of said Sally P. Green the said slaves and then increased and also the principal sum so devised by me for the support of said Sally P. Green be vested and go to the said Betty Craig for her life or against forever.

Now. All the rest and residue of my Estate of whatever nature or kind after ample provision is made for satisfying all the foregoing devises by me made it is my will and desire that the same be equally divided between my two children, to wit; John Green and Betty Jeff Craig to them their heirs and assigns forever.

Now. It is my will and desire that in case I should depart this life before my daughter Betty D. Craig should be divorced from Benjamin Craig or be a lone sole and unmarried on account of her unfortunate union with said Benjamin Craig, then and in that case, it is my will and desire that all the right title and control of all and singular all the estate both real and personal be vested in my friends and relations John Green of Lincoln ^{County} and James Barbour of Mercer County for her benefit and the profit arising therefrom to be for her benefit and control unincumbered from any demands claims title or interest of said Benjamin Craig, and to be subject alone to the demand and control of said Betty as she may desire the same for her support, And I do hereby vote and bequeath unto the said John Green and James Barbour in Trust for the use and purposes aforesaid all the right title interest in and to the aforesaid estate both real and personal which was devised in any way by this my last will and Testament to the said Betty Jeff Craig until such time as the said Betty D. Craig may be a perfect feme sole independent of the authority or control of said Benjamin Craig, then and not until then is it my will and desire that she should take possession of any of the estate real or personal hereby intended to be devised for her benefit. It being expressly my will and desire that the said Benjamin Craig should never obtain the possession control a benefit of any estate real or personal which I have a right to dispose of.

It is further my will and desire that none of the families of Negroes hereby devised should ever be separated, but that each should continue together.

And lastly, I do hereby nominate and appoint my friends and relations John Green of Lincoln County and James Barbour my Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other or former wills by me made and do most earnestly request that they may see this my last will and Testament literally complied with.
