Item I give to my son John three hundred and eleven all the other stock with all the horse furniture and implements of husbandry now in possession of John Martin I do make or ordain my own Heirs and Exors of this my last will and testament with liberty to sell or dispose as much of his property as he shall see proper to educate said John or to supply him in other necessities that is proper in his shop whereof I am head and this twenty eighth day of December 1808

I John Nelson of Campbell County and State of Kentucky being of sound body but of perfect mind and disposing memory and bearing in mind the certainty of death and uncertainty of life do ordain this to be my last will and testament. Rescinding and revoking all former Wills and first I will my soul to God in whose mercy with the merits of Jesus Christ I believe for redemption. Secondly that my body buried in a decent and Christian like manner, and thirdly that my just debts be paid out of the estate it shall please God to bless me with, and the remander to be devised in manner and form following to wit

Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife, Salome Nelson

my dwelling plantation whereon I now live, during her natural life and all my personal estate that I am now possessed of Item I give and bequeath to my son Livingston Nelson One hundred and fifty acres of land where he now lives.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Nelson One hundred and fifty acres of land where he now lives

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Hampton One hundred and fifty acres of land where he now lives

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Robert Nelson One hundred & fifty acres of land where I now live after the death of my wife. First

Item I will that my executors should sell so much of the Residue of my lands as will pay my just debts. Second I will that my daughters, Susanna Faulkner, Mary Ann Faulkner, Frances Nelson, Ann Nelson and Harriet Nelson should each of them receive out of personal estate an equivalent to the before mentioned legacies in kind. after which any property remaining either real or personal to be equally divided among my children but it is to be observed that one negro boy named Mathias that I gave to my daughter Susanna Faulkner is to be retained as part of her dividend of the estate

And I also will that my sons Livingston Nelson and Richard Nelson be my executors of this my last will and testament renouncing all former wills by me made and acknowledged at any time here to fore.
