In the name of god amen I Thomas Padon being in a low state of health but perfectly sound in mind and memory have thought proper to make this my last will and testament and first I recommend my body to the ground and my soul unto god and after a decent buriall my will is that all my just debts should be paid unto them I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Lucy padon all my estate real and personal During her life and widowhood except what shall be mentioned hereafter, but if she my beloved wife Lucy padon should see cause to have again then my will is that she should be put to her thirds a legible as the law directs and I give and bequeath unto my beloved sons John Thomas Padon and Addams padon each two pounds in property when our youngest child Emily padon comes to age but if either of my sons should die before the have heirs the property to return to my wife or the last of my children and also my will is that my two daughters and Addams since have all my wearing apparel and further my will is that after my wife's death that all my estate Real and personal shall be equally Divided between my beloved children namely Elizabeth Ruth Jolie Anne Emily padon and I also appoint my beloved wife Lucy padon and my beloved friend George Brown my Executor to this my last will and testament as witness my hand and seal this 11th day of September 1805
