Leathers and to pay my part of the money into my Executors for them to dispose of as I shall hereafter direct, and further if there should be any of the lands saved in Boone & Gallatin Counties that my father claimed I want the Executors to sell it and pay my part to my Executors for them to dispose of as I shall hereafter direct -

6th I want my Executors to rent my brick house that I have in Covington for the finishing the house & to lease the site of my lot in Covington to any person if they can to the best advantage for improvements on the said lot -

7th I want my Executors to divide my four lots that I have in Covington between my children and give each one their part as they come of age -

8th I want my Executors to call on John Leather & Benjamin Leathers administrators of Thomas P. Leathers deceased for my part of the money and also on the Executors of my father's estate for my proportion coming to me then, and the money that is coming from Deborah Perry and the money coming from Edward Meeke for them to dispose of as I shall hereafter direct -

9th I want my Executors to put the money out at interest and to pay each child their part as they come of age that is to say Annely dead this year when she comes, Eliza Leathers, Joshua Leathers, Lewis P. Leathers, Thelma Leathers, & Levene Leathers -

10th I want my Executors to furnish any one of my children with clothes as the said Executors may think best, which is to be redacted out of their respective parts, and to do the best they can with the beds

and bedding to the children, advantage - I do hereby acknowledge this to be my last will -

Campbell County State of Kentucky 20th John Richardson in the County and State aforesaid being under divine indisposition of body, but of perfect disposing mind and memory, thank be to almighty God for that and all other his many mercies, in me beloved, do make & ordain this to be my last will and testament in the manner and form following viz. 1st I recommend my soul to God who gave it, my body to earth to be decently buried - 2^d My just debts to be paid - 3^d I give to my loving wife all my real & personal property during her life provided she live, my widow all that time, but in case she marry then to have no Right, title, claims or demands whatsoever many parts thereof, nevertheless it is my will and desire that if she do not marry she may at her death dispose of my wife or otherwise one third part of what is in her possession except the land, and the land to be equally divided between Thomas Richardson, Ohio Richardson, Richard Richardson & No. 4 Richardson, and all the personal estate such as the crop

that is now growing, here, ^{for} Bettle and sleep into her bed after the death of my beloved wife, and to be equally divided between Maryann Taylor, Julia Richardson, John Richardson, Sophia Richardson and Elizabeth Bond and also leave unto Elizabeth Richell York, money to be paid in a bed and furniture. In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and giving seal this 6th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen. -

In the name of God, Amen: I, Moses Vickers, of the County of Campbell & State of Kentucky calling to mind the uncertainty of death and the uncertainty of this mortal life. And being now of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will & Testament in manner and form following; that is to say, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Vickers after payment of all my last debts & funeral charges, all my Estate both real and personal so long as she remains my Widow for the purpose of supporting herself and my children and educating them during their minority. And should it so happen that after

my decease my Wife Nancy should marry another husband or should my Executors hereafter named be satisfied that all my children are not equally and impartially treated by her. Then I will that my Executors have her Dowry Sett off to her, according to law, and the Residue of my Estate sold at public Vendue and the proceeds of such sale equally divided among my children herein named Viz, William, James, John, Elly, Betsey, Melinda, Deborah, Carson, Robert and Maria. When the youngest child shall have arrived at full age in case she shall so long live. - Otherwise, When the youngest child of them living shall have arrived at full age. And in case of the marriage of my wife, or of the decease of any of my children then the proceeds of the sale aforesaid mentioned to be divided among my surviving children in the same manner as upon the death of my Wife. I do also will and direct, that, my Wife's daughter Susanah Scott have a common Education till the Expenses of my Estate. And lastly I do hereby appoint and nominate & Repute John Arnold, Elmer Scott and Elfred Bond, Executors of the last will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 27th of June the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & nineteen.
