State of Kentucky; And I hereby give and bequeath
unto my beloved wife Amy Reynolds all my personal estate
goods and chattels of what kind & nature soever to be
left solely at her disposal hoping & trusting she will
act honorably & justly towards her children that are
now living. And furthermore it is my will that
the land bequeathed as above mentioned shall
remain in the possession of my wife as long as she
remains my widow And to have the benefit accruing
from a Cultivation thereof which she may appropriate
to any use she may deem proper In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the Thirtieth
day of January in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and Eight Campbell County
State of Kentucky
