

I Robert Duckworth of Campbell County in the State of Kentucky do hereby Declare this to be my last will and testament to wit that at my Decease my property of what kind soever it may be shall be fairly and impartially valued and Divided up in the following manner that is to say one third of it shall be appropriated to the use of my wife During the term of her natural life without allowing to make any waste of the same: The remainder shall be divided into as many equal portions as I may have children at the time of my decease except that to the children of my former wife there shall be one hundred pound sterling worth more appropriated than to those of my present wife that is Supposing I should have three children by my former wife Living at the time each of them three shall have £33:6:8 more than any one child by the present wife if two only each of them two shall have £50 more if one only that one shall have £100 more than children shall severally obtain full possession of the property hereby bequeathed to them at the age of 21 and the property of which my wife will hereby be intitled to the use of During her life shall at her Decease be equally divided among the whole should any property be bequeathed to me by any relation of my former wife it shall be divided equally among her children and should any be bequeathed to me by any relation of my present wife it shall be divided equally among her children should any of my children Die after my Decease and before ~~before~~ they attain to the age of 21 years the property hereby bequeathed to them shall be divided among the survivors according to the foregoing rule and to the intent that the above mentioned provisions may be carried into full and complete effect and that my children may be properly taken care of and educated I hereby constitute and appoint Henry testimony of Franklin County and

George Brown of Pendleton County and William Daniel of Campbell County my executors with full power to Receive Distribute and dispose of my property in such a manner as they may think most consistent with Justice and with the interest of my children and with the full execution of this will provided however that no sale of any ^{part} of my ^{part} property shall be valid without their unanimous Concurrence and my children shall severally obtain full possession and enjoyment of the property hereby bequeathed to them from time to time as they shall each of them attain to the age of 21 years.
